

Becoming an interactive innovation support advisor

Supporting interactive innovation processes requires sound knowledge of the innovation process itself as well as mastering communication skills and tools to involve diverse actors and to stimulate the innovation process. The course addresses **students and lecturers**. Application closing date is Monday 29th April.

The course in a nutshell

COSTS

240 € (includes 6 overnight stays with breakfast, lunch, coffee breaks, evening meal). Training materials are covered by the project.

Transport* to and from Kilkenny city (to meet airport bus/train) will be in place on Sunday 21st and Saturday 22nd. All other costs (such as travel) are on the expense of the participant.

Training concept and objectives

The training is organised in a blended learning format. It starts with the online kick-off meeting to introduce basic concepts around innovations (types, adoption, diffusion) and advisory methods to bring all participants to the same level of knowledge. The five days presence workshop in Ireland allows participants to acquire methodological competencies (attitudes and skills) that are necessary to facilitate interactive innovation processes and reflect their own role through an experiential learning approach. The training is completed with an online webinar which encourages participants to reflect on how they have or could use their learnings from the course.

The training will be conducted by experienced trainers (and advisors), and together with a field visit, practical innovation cases will be discussed.

PARTICIPANTS

Up to 30 students (under- and post-graduate, PhD candidates) with some knowledge in the field of counseling, extension/advisory work and participatory methods, and with an interest in the profession of an advisor.

Up to 4 participants involved in teaching at universities or colleges on the topic of advisory services, innovation and rural development.

All participants must attend the online phase prior to the in person meeting in Kildalton College.
