

Prospects for Farmers' Support:

Advisory Services in European AKIS (PRO AKIS)



Main actors of AKIS:

(a) administration: Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Fisheries; Ministry of Science, Innovation and Higher Education; Ministry of Environment;

(b) education and research: Universities (2); Agricultural Colleges (10); Knowledge Centres (KCA); Pig Research Centre (PRC); GTS-Institute;

(c) extension: Advisory Service Centres: 30 independent local ASC; Knowledge Centre for Agriculture; the farner owned and controlled the Danish Agricultural Advisory Service (DAAS) dominated;


Others: farmer owned LVK, Patriotisk Selskab and small private advisory companies; Horticulture: Danish-Dutch joint venture HortiAdvice Scandinavia;

- (d) upstream industries;
- (e) Danish Agriculture and Food Council

Cooperation between AKIS actors:

is going well, although the DAAS cooperation dominates the market of advisory services

AKIS DIAGRAM



Main sources of funding the advisory services:

private funding; public support to farmers education; agricultural sector's own funds, membership fees, direct user payment, production levies (11) and taxes on pesticides (15% in total)

Main supplier(s) of advisory services:

DAAS-cooperation (KCA as main co-operator)

Main clients:

- (1) large commercial farms;
- (2) medium commercial farms;
- (3) young farmers

Main topics of advice:

book-keeping, taxes, plant and animal production, renewable energy (for all three target groups) and additionally business and diversification of production for young farmers

Main methods:

large variety of methods are being used, but mainly individual and group, e.g. face-to-face and visits in the farm (40%); demonstrations, workshops, and field days, meeting with farmers at the office (30%); meeting with groups of farmers (10%)
