

## Prospects for Farmers' Support:

# Advisory Services in European AKIS (PRO AKIS)



#### Main actors of AKIS:

(a) public sector: Ministry of Agriculture; Ministry of Education; Ministry of Economics; regional development agencies; Latvian Rural Advisory and Training Centre (LRATC), National Rural Network (NRN); Centre of Technology and Knowledge Transfer and business incubator Valdeka of the Latvia University of Agriculture; Jelgava Innovation Centre (with 5 business incubators);

(b) education and research: Latvia University of Agriculture and 5 regional universities; vocational schools (secondary and colleges);

(c) private sector: input providers, processing companies, private consulting companies, experts, Latvian Federation of Food Enterprises (LFFE);

(d) FBOs: Consultative Council of Agricultural Organisations (CCAO); Farmers' Saeima (professional and commercial producers); farmers' NGOs; Regional farmers' organisations (22); farmers cooperatives; Latvian Association of Agricultural Cooperatives (LACA); (e) NGOs: e.g. AgroCentrs (education and information); Latvias Dabas fonds;


(f) other: rural women organisations, local partnerships, consumer organisations;

(g) extension: Latvian Rural Advisory and Training Centre (LRATC)

## Cooperation between AKIS actors:

in general, advisory organisations operate rather independently from each other, but there are various common formal and informal cooperation, e.g. projects, education, seminars, consultations, etc.

#### Main sources of funding the advisory services:

mixed: state and other public and private funding; there is introduced fee for advisory services, too

Latvian Rural Advisory and Training Centre (LRATC)

#### Main clients:

- (3) agricultural producer groups

### Main topics of advice:

plant and animal production, bookkeeping, taxes

#### Main methods:

various methods, but the main are conventional individual consultations on or outside farm; also telephone helpdesks, small group advices and traditional media: publications, radio and TV and group discussions





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
